ent Loves..., the fabulous treasure trove located at 11 High Street, has turned 5 years old. The shop opened on 5th July 2020 and owner Jo Glazebrook is thrilled that it's gone from strength to strength.

The birthday celebrations over the weekend of 5th and 6th July were delightful, assisted by glorious summer weather. The Town Crier attended, with bunting and balloons creating a suitably party atmosphere. Cakes, strawberries, wines, and soft drinks were offered; with seating in front of the shop and in the courtyard, there were plenty of spots to enjoy a drink.

Several makers from the shop demonstrated their crafts, including stained glass, crocheting, resin shell production, ceramics and natural & vegan skincare products. It was wonderful to see the makers in action. Jo had arranged a kids' colouring competition, offering £10 Kent Loves... vouchers as prizes.

There was a fabulous raffle, with over 25 prizes donated by the designers from the

shop, plus a £50 voucher for the Wishful Thinker donated by The Lenham Focus. The raffle was extremely popular and raised a wonderful sum, with proceeds donated to two local families affected by a house fire in Douglas Road in June.

Looking for a new challenge, Jo had a 'light bulb moment' late one night and the idea of **Kent Loves...** was born – to offer space to local designers who don't need a whole shop; they just need a shelf to sell their crafts. The shop opened with an initial roster of 20 designers.

Since opening, designers have come and gone, which means that there is always something fresh on the shelves. The shop has grown to showcase 75 makers, all based in Kent and many local to Lenham. Over the years, Jo has supported 127 makers in total! The shop's reputation is such that designers now come to Jo, rather than the other way around. Many of the makers choose to work a shift in the shop.

Jo is committed to evolving the business whilst also offering a great variety of goods for sale. Behind the shop, there's a courtyard with a separate room; once used to serve afternoon teas, it now houses beautiful Frenchic chalk paints.

The flower-filled courtyard has been transformed with outdoor cushions and garden items from Your Paradise at Home and Jo will soon sell coffee, making it a perfect shopping pit stop.

Kent Loves Catering, run by Anna
Livesey alongside Jo, provides catering
services for functions in the local area.
They offer delicious bespoke spreads for
any occasion, gaining new customers
through word of mouth.

Jo places significant emphasis on supporting the local community any way that she can. She has made afternoon

teas for individuals as recommended by the Parish Council, she is a great supporter of local charities The Friends of St Mary's and Lenham Meadows Trust, selling their products and event tickets, she supports Wooden Tots Nursery with donations, operates a well-received community library book swap and has provided a work experience placement for a student from The Lenham School. She is an advocate for supporting small local businesses and is keen to collaborate to try to ensure that we have a vibrant Lenham high street that is a draw for locals and visitors.

Shops may come and go, but it is safe to say that Kent Loves... is here to stay.

It's not-so-Crazy Golf!

ou may think that 'crazy golf' is a pastime to keep the children amused at the seaside.

Not so! Crazy Golf – or Minigolf as it's more accurately called – is a serious sport played in a highly competitive way and in international competitions. And here, based in Lenham, we have the Chair of the British Minigolf Association, Martin Greenhead.

Martin has been playing competitively since 2011, ever since he played at the Hastings pirate adventure golf course and now represents Great Britain internationally.

He explains: 'Whilst the game is great fun and has a great community atmosphere, it is also a serious and skilled sport. I have just returned from the World Minigolf Championships held in Gothenburg, Sweden where over 100 representatives from countries from as far away as the USA, Portugal and Japan played games over a two-week period to claim the world title.

I was one of two teams of four players representing the UK and claimed a place in the top 10 finalists.'

'Tournaments take place across the globe organised via the World Minigolf

Federation and sponsored by 'Urban Crazy', a company that builds crazy-golf courses.

I have recently played in Portugal and I will be competing in the British Open championships in Hastings on 27th and 28th September 2025 where I hope to guarantee my spot in the world adventure golf tour finals.

Next year, I'll be off to a competition in Germany. We're even working on an application to get the sport recognised for the Olympic Games.

Martin, ranked number 3 in Great Britain, works as an accountant for BP and spends most of his holidays touring with the UK team and loves every minute of it. Media interest has been high with reports of the game in The Times and The Daily Mirror plus a feature on Good Morning Britain.

There are several courses in Kent if you want to give it a go. As well as several courses in Hastings, there are sites at Leeds Castle, The Ridge golf course and Margate.

Stay Scam-Savvy:

Protect Yourself and Loved Ones

very year, scammers steal an estimated £3.5 billion from people across the UK. These criminals don't just stop at one victim – they often share your personal details with others, making you a target again and again. *Neil Butcher*, Victim Safeguarding Officer at Kent Trading Standards, shares his top tips to help you stay safe and one step ahead of the scammers.

Golden Rule: Never share personal details with strangers

If someone contacts you out of the blue – by phone, text, email, or even letter – and asks for your bank details, passwords, or money, don't engage. Even if they claim to be from your bank, HMRC, or say you've won a prize, it's likely to be a scam.

Protect your personal information

Before throwing away old bills, receipts, or prescription bags, make sure your personal details are unreadable. Use a shredder, cut them up, or black out information with a permanent marker.

What to do if you're targeted:

Think you've been scammed? Call Citizens Advice Consumer Helpline: 0808 223 1133 or contact your bank directly by dialling 159.

Online scam? Call Citizens Advice Scam Action Line: 0808 250 5050

Common scams to watch out for:

Phone Scams

You might get a call from someone claiming to be from Amazon, saying there's suspicious activity on your account. **Hang up immediately.** Always wait for a dial tone before making another call or ring a trusted friend to make sure the line is clear.

Register your landline with the **Telephone Preference Service: 0345 070 0707.** Text **"TPS"** and your email address to **85095** to block mobile spam.

Text Scams

Texts that appear to be from HMRC demanding immediate payment or threatening arrest are **fake**. Don't click any links or respond.



WhatsApp & Messaging Scams

Scammers often pose as a family member or friend, saying they've lost their phone and need money urgently. If you get a message like "Hi Mum/Dad/Gran," pause and check who is calling you before doing anything.

Postal Scams

Letters claiming you've won a lottery you never entered, or from clairvoyants offering to reveal your future, for a fee, are classic scams. Reduce junk mail by registering with the **Mail Preference Service: 0845 703 4599**

Heathlands – a picture emerges

Some of you may have visited the two recent events organised by Maidstone Borough Council and its delivery partner, Homes England. Predictably, these contained little new detail about the Heathlands development although it was part of the exercise to create a Supplementary Planning Document (SPD). The SPD is supposed to contain the detail about Heathlands which was missing at the inspection of the local plan in 2023. We remain concerned that it will not.

The local plan containing the Heathlands proposal was adopted by the previous (Conservative) MBC administration just ahead of the local election, in May 2024, where they were voted out. It was accepted by the current (Green, Lib-Dem, Independent) administration which is now rolling it out.

While the parish council acknowledges there is a national issue with housing, and the neighbourhood plan sets out how the parish will contribute to that, we also think there is an issue with affordability and placement: that requires the right homes, at the right price, in the right place. In our view this is not what Heathlands will be.

The parish council, along with our elected borough and county councillors (including our former county councillor Shellina Prendergast), have attended meetings since November 2024 to

examine the detail. What follows is our assessment of that process and what we believe is ahead.

We have challenged those proposing this development with our assessment and there was no push-back on our assumptions, so I am sharing these with everyone now.

Be under no illusion, this is badged as a "Garden Community" - that is "code" for the creation of a new town.

We are told the new town will have up to 5,000 homes, 2,000 of which will be some form of social housing (yet to be determined), create 5,000 new employment opportunities (also undetermined) three new service centres (although at present it is not clear exactly what these will contain) and a new water treatment works. During the lifetime of the project there will also be new schools (both primary and secondary) and, critically, a new railway station will have to be delivered during the first phase.

There is not enough space here to detail other issues, such as GP services. That will be a matter for the Strategic Health Authority to resolve. I have also not mentioned the issue of traffic; we have repeatedly raised concerns about this but there has been little meaningful response. That, along with where the water for 12,000 souls is going to come from, or exactly how any of this is going to be paid for clearly sits in the "too difficult to do" box...

Instead, I will focus on something which has become clearer as we have listened and questioned the details of this proposal as these have come forward (such as they are), that is

"density" – specifically, how this number of properties are going to fit onto the available land. So, we need to get a little technical to realise exactly what is being proposed.

This site is roughly 360 hectares (900 acres in old money). Once all the natural "constraints" are accounted for (that is woodland, listed properties, streams, ponds and other places where it will not be possible to build, including rehoming the travellers who own a site on Forstal Road) and then factoring in the infrastructure to support the new households, (such as the schools, the station, new workplaces (warehouses?), the new water treatment works -and cordon-sanitaire around that-plus the necessary greenspace) what we reckon is that around 100 hectares remains for housing.

This equates to an average of 50 dwellings per hectare.

The homes proposed under the Lenham Neighbourhood Plan, which will deliver 1,000 new homes in a structured way up to 2031, do not exceed 28 homes per hectare. For an urban comparison, the extension to the west of Ashford, known as Repton Park, is around 45 dwellings per hectare. That development is perfectly appropriate for its setting as an extension of Ashford. Something of that density, or greater, is unlikely to sit well in what are presently open fields and grassland.

We understand the area between the A20 and the railway, which is closest to the

Downs, will need to be "softer" (presumably a lower density or height of dwellings to achieve that) which means that the area between the railway and the M20 will therefore need to be a higher density, with more

height, to maintain the overall number.

We are assured the Heathlands development will be "an exemplar", quite of what is unclear. What we think will emerge this autumn is a slick brochure extolling the "exemplar" nature of this proposal, while glossing over the awkward issues of creating a new town with a reliance on multi-storey, high-density buildings for 12,000 people in the countryside.

We suspect MBC and its delivery partner, Homes England, will be referencing a Poundbury-style approach to Heathlands (this is the development in Dorset created by the Duchy Estates formed by Prince, now King, Charles as his vision of an ideal place to live). Our assessment is it is going to have to be more like Thamesmead, the ultra-urban, high density, high-rise development bordering the Thames in southeast London.

Once this proposal has been adopted, an Outline Planning Application will then be pulled together and that is likely to be discussed at some point in 2026. We think this will describe four "phases" of development, stretching well into the 2050s.

Our opportunity to make further comments will come when the Supplementary Planning Document is circulated for public comment probably later this year. It's then we will see whether our assessment was right, or not.



An update from your local MP, Helen Whately



o you want to see Eurostar calling at Ebbsfleet and Ashford again? Is it a service you would use if it was reinstated, or does it make no difference to you at all?

If you have strong opinions about the Eurostar service, I'd love to hear from you. It was not that long ago when Kent residents could just hop on a train at Ebbsfleet or Ashford and be in Europe within hours. I want to understand how this change is impacting your life.

Eurostar currently connects London to Paris, Lille, Brussels, Amsterdam, Rotterdam and has plans to extend its service to Frankfurt and Geneva. According to their website more than 280,000 passengers travelled on the London-Paris route last year and 250,000 on the London-Brussels route, and crucially they are making money again.

It's not just holiday makers and day trippers who want Eurostar to stop in Kent. Businesses chose to locate in the county due to our easy access to both London and Europe. When Eurostar called at Kent stations it boosted our economy by encouraging tourists from Europe, took pressure off the Dover crossing and provided a more environmentally friendly way to travel.

It was understandable that services stopped calling at Kent stations during the Pandemic, but that was 5 years ago, and I know peoples' patience is wearing thin. That's why I have been pressing Eurostar and Rail Ministers to reinstate services for some years now, and it seems like finally we might be making progress. New potential operators (Virgin, Heuro, and Evolyn) have



expressed an interest in running crosschannel trains. And the Office of Rail and Road (ORR) found that some capacity could be made available at the Temple Mill maintenance depot in north-east London – the only facility in the UK which can accommodate European-style trains.

I recently pressed Ministers for progress, and they told me that there are several potential new operators being considered. But the jury is still out and the Minister's response didn't convey a sense of urgency or commitment. So, I will continue to press them by asking parliamentary questions about their next steps and a timeline.

I would be grateful if you would take part in my 'Helen Whately Eurostar survey'. I can then use your contributions as evidence.


Book Review from the Lenham Library

ometimes a book from our non-fiction shelves captures your attention and this month I picked up a book entitled 'Food Noise: How weight loss medications & smart nutrition can silence your cravings' by Dr Jack Mosley. If the name sounds familiar, Jack is the son of the popular presenter and author, the late Dr Michael Mosley.

There has been much publicity about the new weight loss drugs, said to be the biggest medical breakthrough in decades, helping to combat the rising levels of obesity and diabetes in the population. Although the drugs are reported to banish food cravings and encourage weight loss, the question remains how you lose the weight in a healthy manner and sustain it for life.

This book is clear and easy to read. The information is backed by rigorous scientific research and explains how constant, unwanted thoughts about food can be impossible to silence in our world of compelling marketing messages and ongoing temptation.

The book gives some guidance on the use of the drugs and the possible side effects of this medication. However, the most



useful information concerns
the diet and nutritional
information essential to
keep us healthy, whether
we need to lose weight or
not. The author stresses
the importance that a nonmedicated route (such as
'The Fast 800') may be just
as effective and professional
advice should be sought
before using medication. I
found the book interesting
as it sets out to empower

people with the knowledge and practical tools to take some control of their health and make informed decisions when taking these new drugs.

The book provides a seven day meal plan and lots of healthy recipes to maintain weight loss including black bean brownies and high-fibre crackers for gut health.

Remember your local library has a good selection of recipe books to help you eat healthily and to prepare family meals on a budget.

A reminder that throughout August, Kent libraries will be hosting The Summer Reading Challenge. It's a free activity for all 4- to 11-year-olds. This year it is called Story Garden so look out for adventures in Nature and the Great Outdoors.

Nature Watch

Meet the Finches

he next family we visit is the finches. There are more than fifteen types of finch in the UK and they have quite a range of different appearances. Some of them can be found commonly in your garden like the chaffinch or goldfinch, while others are more at home in woodlands or open fields. They are a small to medium size bird and have a sweet song. They can have short triangular beaks which are perfect for eating smaller seeds, or larger beaks meant for crushing hard seeds. Others still have crossed bills for prying open cones.



The Brambling



The Goldfinch

A small, slender bird that has a pale bill and a red, white and black face. Its body has a brown back and breast with black wings that have bright yellow (or gold) bars. They can be found in both garden and field and love seeds, especially thistle in the fields but they do like sunflower hearts if you put seeds out in birdfeeders. In recent years their numbers have been increasing as they benefit from garden bird feeding.



The Chaffinch

A very common bird that is seen and heard a lot in the garden. The male and female look quite different; the male's plumage is a smart blend of slate and terracotta while the female is more subdued with olives and browns. Chaffinches often feed on the ground beneath hedgerows and trees, performing a distinctive doublehop forward as they search for seeds and insects, which they also do underneath bird feeders. I also think they have a bit of a clumsy flight. During winter, they form loose flocks in farmland and woodland edges, sometimes joining other finch species in mixed feeding groups.

Most often seen within a flock of chaffinches and during the autumn and winter months. The brambling is a winter visitor from Scandinavia and it resembles the chaffinch so much that it can be hard to see in the midst of a flock of them, but they sport a distinctive orange-buff breast and white rump that is visible in flight. They'll fly to the ground to look for tasty morsels and seeds and often wait for some time while making sure the coast is clear. Initially they look fairly plain but you will soon see that they have a beauty all their own.

The Greenfinch

The greenfinch has had a tough time in recent years as it has been the victim of a disease but lately it's been slowly increasing in number. The male and female are different in appearance but only in colour, both are still green but the male is quite a vibrant green while the female is a dull green or even olive. They have a fairly vibrant yellow edging to their wings and while they are fairly brave with other birds, they tend to be a bit nervous around humans.

The Lesser Redpoll

Again this little bird can be hard to tell from some of the other little brown birds in our gardens but the distinctive red cap it has gives it away and gives it the name. They have a bouncing flight and an acrobatic feeding style, often hanging upside-down

from the thinnest of twigs. Numbers of Lesser redpolls grow in gardens during late winter and early spring as they make use of bird feeders and some of the trees and plants there.

The Siskin

These small but very bright birds are more common around autumn and winter. Streaky yellow-green finches with black caps (in males) and distinctive forked tails are primarily woodland birds that increasingly visit gardens during winter. The males are very bright yellow and have a black cap on their head while the females are a little less brightly coloured and have a streaky appearance.

There are many other varieties of finch and some are startling like the bullfinch or the hawfinch with their looks or colours, or both. Keep your eye out for them and your ears too, for their beautiful song. The behaviour of finches does change with the season. In spring you will see them become more territorial and they sing more to attract mates. In summer they will be nesting and rearing their chicks. But as autumn moves in they can form larger feeding flocks that will have many birds in them and even different types of finch banding together. In winter they will then be joined by finches from all over the UK and even other countries. If you keep bird feeders and use sunflower hearts and nyjer seed you will attract them to your garden -and sometimes in large numbers.





Climate Change is Happening

Pat Crawford provides the RURAL FOCUS PRESS GROUP COMMENT AND ADVICE COLUMN

ccording to a report issued by the IMF (International Monetary Fund) at the end of May, debt is higher and rising faster in 80% of the global economy. The study involved 175 world economies, two-thirds of which have higher public debt than before the pandemic. (The IMF is a reliable source of information.)

What has this got to do with climate change? A lot because beleaguered governments delay or even cancel plans that could be deemed not immediately urgent. No doubt a lot of the ambitious promises made at the last COP (Conference of the Parties) held in Baku last November will fall into the 'not urgent' category. The next climate change conference is due to be held in November in Brazil; it will be interesting to see how attitudes have changed, meanwhile some disillusioned observers suggest COP is a Cop-out!

Canada, a big wheat producing country, is suffering terrifying wildfires with over 200,000 hectares already burnt, triple the five-year average. Climate change is reported to have fuelled both the scale and severity of the fires. Meanwhile here in the UK human actions (careless disposal of barbecue residues, cigarette butts, etc) continue to account for most of the wildfires to date this year.

New South Wales is one of the latest regions to suffer extreme flooding. An estimated 10,000 buildings were damaged of which 1,000 were left uninhabitable; saddest of all, five people died. The Australian government reports that the country's land surface has warmed 1.5C since 1910 and confirms that climate



change is responsible for an increase in the numbers and severity of Extreme Weather Events.

Farmers Guardian (30th May) published a report by Chris Brayford drawing attention to farmers' fury concerning the way in which the UK government is prioritising solar farms over food production, thereby impacting food security. Observers point out that the UK needs more houses, more wind farms and more solar farms; meanwhile public access to the countryside and consideration for wildlife and biodiversity are also important factors. Food security is vital. The ways land is used must be subjected to increasing scrutiny.

The Financial Times special report 'Europe's Climate Leaders' is a fascinating read and not just for those interested in climate change. British farmers produce food to the highest ethical standards. They need – and deserve – our appreciation and support.



North Downs Walk - the sun shone on the righteous

he Rotary Club of the Weald of Kent held its annual North Downs Walk on Sunday 8th June. After a week of dodgy weather, and a Met Office warning of thunderstorms the day before, the 340 walkers were blessed with superb weather – dry, sunny and with a cooling breeze.

The event is a **sponsored** walk in support of **Cancer Research UK** and of the walkers' own choice of good causes. With a variety of routes from 1 mile (fully paved, therefore suitable for wheelchairs or baby buggies) to 9 miles including a climb up the North Downs, we attracted a full range of ages and abilities of walkers, including Scouts, Guides, Air Cadets, keen hikers and some family teams.

Early indications, based on the pledges on walkers' sponsorship forms are that the Walk will have raised about £20,000 once Gift Aid is included, of which about two-thirds will go to CRUK and the rest to causes nominated by the walkers (many of which are also cancer-related).

Jean Shrubb, president of the Weald Rotary Club, said, "This is a fantastic result and a real community effort involving the walkers, volunteers, local farmers and of course our sponsor. Well done everyone who made the walk happen".

Chas Bedford, chairman of the organising committee paid tribute to the small army of volunteers, drawn from families and friends of members, other Rotary clubs and the sixth form of Oakwood Park Grammar School.



They acted as route marshals, greeted walkers at checkpoints, registered walkers and sponsor forms, and staffed the kitchen – producing 450 ploughman's lunches, strawberries and cream, and hot and cold drinks. "A lot of walkers have praised how friendly and professional our helpers were. I want to thank all of them. I also want to thank Family Funeral Service, our event sponsor, who has underwritten all our expenses again, meaning that every penny raised in sponsorship has gone to the charities and not to overheads".

Rotary is committed to protecting the environment; all of the disposable lunchboxes, cups and cutlery were Vegware compostables. Other waste was separated into categories for recycling, leaving almost no 'general waste' going to landfill.

Weald of Kent Rotary have been running the North Downs Walk since 1985, missing only 2020 due to lockdowns, and intend to continue running it as long as there are walkers.

Planning for the 2026 walk has already started. Save the date: 14th June 2026.


