A Story about Puritan Troublemakers and President F. D. Roosevelt' (part 1)

homas Reader from Lenham and Robert Couchman from Rolvenden were sent to West Gate Prison in Canterbury for libel. This was in 1603 and their libel had not been of famous people but of the church. The two friends and Thomas' brother Helchea had pinned libelous corruptions of the phrase, "God have mercy", on various church doors in Canterbury. Robert Couchman wrote later about prison: "many lie there and are poysoned by the ill ayre and usage, and besides one knoweth not whether they will hang one or not, they are so violent and mercilesse to al opposites...' Helchea got away very lightly because this was possibly his first offence. Thomas and Robert, however, had been in conflict with the authorities for quite a while. As early as 1597 they were accused of 'refusing to receive the holy sacrament at our ministers hand being contrary to her majesties laws'. Thomas Reader and Robert Couchman were both apprenticed to a candlemaker. Cheap candles in those days were made of tallow (animal fat) and therefore it was convenient to run such a business near the cattle market and the butchers' shambles (slaughter houses) in the Parish of St. George, The Martyr in Canterbury. The area was not one of the best

because of the stench of animal dung and blood which hung in the air. Being apprenticed in Canterbury would have given the young men good prospects of eventually becoming Freemen of the city of Canterbury. So why did the Reader brothers, scions of a wealthy Lenham family, seemingly decide to throw their future away? (more in next *Focus*).



ANOTHER GREAT INITIATIVE FROM YOUR LENHAM FOCUS

Lenham Nursery - an update report from Sally Barr for Focus readers

eaders may be aware that the government continues to promote its "free" places for 3-4 year olds and has recently introduced "free" places for 2 year olds. In the media we hear about the millions of pounds being allocated to the Early Years Sector, which sounds wonderful (in theory). The reality, however, is that this actually equates to £4:55 an hour per 3 year old and £5.65 an hour per 2 year old. This amount is estimated to have fallen by 12% in the last 10 years and, as you will be aware, costs in our rent, utilities, staffing and resources have risen hugely above the rates we currently get per child.

This is the same for all nurseries and in fact, according to OFSTED, almost 250 nurseries across the South East closed down between March and August 2023. What the government should be saying is that they are offering "funded" places, not "free" places, as it is impossible for most nurseries to provide their services at a loss, as highlighted in the national press recently.

Our main aim at Lenham Nursery has always been to provide high quality, age-appropriate education for our young children. We do not want to compromise on our staff-to-children ratios; we also need an extra member of staff as we have the added complication of the children's toilets not being within the nursery room. We are determined to stay open and to keep providing stimulating learning



experiences for the children of Lenham. This involves a lot of hard work from the staff and trustees, so we owe them a huge thank you!

Some good news... On a brighter note, another group we need to say 'thank you' to is Lenham Parish Council! (LPC) Many will be aware of our ongoing plans to build a new nursery and finally, thanks to the amazing support from LPC, it looks like our dreams will be coming true this year! It was always within the Lenham Neighbourhood plan to provide enough nursery places for the increasing population of Lenham. We are delighted to share with everyone that LPC have agreed to use monies gained from development contributions in Lenham to work as matchfunding within a grant application to the Borough Council. We are hoping that with the match-funding in place, the nursery build will start later this year.

As a charity run nursery, we will still be responsible for furnishing and equipping the nursery so our fundraising efforts within the local community will continue. Our next event is being hosted by 'The Wishful Thinker', where we will be running an Easter Egg Hunt on Sunday March 24th – all are welcome!

Lenham Nursery has been supported by the Co-op during the last year by having a collection point at their tills. In December, we found out that we had received £1,000 to spend on new outside play equipment, which we will be able to use on our present site and take to the new nursery, so many thanks to the Co-op!

Finally, a special thank you goes to Philip Jarvis who kindly supported our Santa's Grotto event back in December. The children had a lovely time chatting with Santa and receiving their gifts – seen in the photograph here. It resulted in us raising £180 for the nursery funds.

The Lenham Osteopath

A day in the Osteopath Clinic - Chris Tempest

elcome to this addition of 'a day in the clinic with the Lenham Osteopath'.

It's been a few weeks since I last spoke to you all about various health issues and this month I have a new one for you. Recently I have found a number of patients coming to see me with lower back issues - thankfully most will resolve within weeks/months but unfortunately we have seen that Discogenic issues are on the rise! Be careful when lifting!

DISCOGENIC SPINAL PAIN

Discogenic pain involves degenerative changes of the intervertebral disc (the squidgy part in between the bones of the spine) including structural defects that can result in bio-mechanical instability and inflammation.

What are the symptoms of discogenic pain? Pain on bending forward, sitting, sneezing, coughing (you may find relief when you lay down). Pain in the back of your thigh or buttocks especially when sitting down. Neck pain when you try to tilt your head into flexion (dropping your chin to chest). Muscle spasms in the neck or arms when you do some upper or lower body movements.

How long can it last? Unfortunately if you cause inflammation to a disc, it can take months not weeks to recover. That being a radical injury arising from lifting a heavy cement mixer on a building site, lifting far too heavy in a gym environment (squats/dead lifts) or overloading our spine by trauma-induced pressure. The dull diffuse pain may last for months, but any associated pain pins & needles/parasthesia hopefully should be able to be treated and therefore resolved faster.

How can it be treated? There are various techniques in practice that we use to resolve and speed up the symptoms/process of

discogenic pain. The main ones would be decompressive manual therapy followed by and complimented with exercises, non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs and painkillers if needed. Medical acupuncture can also really excel in this condition - we've had some incredible results in practice using this method. All of the above aim to reduce inflammation and improve mobility.

What about long term effects? Most patients will make a full recovery within the timescales discussed. However, there may be some patients who may not reach 100%, but these are very rare cases.

How do I avoid getting it? In short, the most common age-range for a disc injury is male 20-40 yrs of age. If you're within that group, be very cautious when lifting heavy objects and be sure not to overdo it! Keep the spine strong but also supple - flexibility/ stretches will help tremendously and obviously regular osteopathic treatment will help to achieve this.

A new arrival at Glebe Pond!

enham Parish Council recently asked a specialist tree company, Invicta Arboriculture, to carry out a comprehensive inspection at a number of locations around the Parish, one of which was Glebe Pond. We were provided with a detailed report on the health of the trees at the pond and were pleased to find out that many are in good health.

However, the report contained a number of recommendations. Unfortunately, six trees (two ash trees, two cherry trees, a hawthorne and a willow) had to be felled as they were in extremely poor condition. All six were either already predominantly dead or showed significant irreversible decay and/or disease, including Ash Die Back. It is always such a shame when a tree has to be felled but we must of course act on the recommendations of experts; our priority is to best care for the land around the pond and ensure the safety of our visitors.

Of the six, the stumps of two of them, a hawthorne and a willow, will be left to regenerate. We'll assess whether there are opportunities to plant new native trees at the pond and will update on this in the autumn.

Meanwhile, one of the trunks has had a new lease of life having been carved into a wonderful fish - see the cover picture of this month's issue! The fish was created

by Les Langley, who very kindly donated the carving to the Trust; thank you Les. He uses a chainsaw to produce his fabulous creations and is certainly very skilled. Les undertakes commissions



and bespoke carvings, and you can contact him on 07885 226234 or via email at chainsawcarvingwizard@hotmail.com and see more on his website www.leslanglevchainsawcarver.com. We hope you agree that the carving is a

great addition to Glebe Pond. You can find out more about Les on page 14 of this issue of the Focus.



Recipe of the Month Italian Stuffed Aubergines

This is such a lovely recipe when remembering blissful days in the Italian sun. Serves 6 as a first course or 3 for lunch.

Ingredients:

3 Medium Aubergines Olive Oil

- 1 Onion, chopped
- 1 large Garlic clove, crushed
- 2 tsps Fresh Basil or 1 tsp dried
- 6 drained Anchovy fillets, chopped
- (6oz) Italian Mozzarella Cheese cut into thin slices
- 3 large tomatoes, sliced
- 1½ tbsp drained capers, lightly chopped Salt and freshly milled black pepper

Method:

Trim the green stalks from the aubergines and slice the aubergines in half lengthwise. Remove the centre of the aubergines using a teaspoon, leaving not less than 5mm (1/4") thick. Sprinkle the shells liberally with salt and leave upside down to drain for 45 minutes. Meanwhile chop the pulp.

Heat 2 tbsp of the oil in a saucepan and gently fry the onions until softened. Stir in the chopped pulp, crushed garlic and half



the basil. Season with salt and pepper and cook over a low heat for about 10 minutes, stirring now and then. After this stir in the chopped anchovies.

Wipe the drained aubergine shells with kitchen paper and arrange in small oiled roasting tin or baking dish. Spoon the pulp mixture into the shells, then arrange alternate slices of cheese and tomato on top of each aubergine half and sprinkle with the chopped capers.

Finally sprinkle over the remaining basil and dribble a little oil over each. Season and bake (uncovered) at 180C for about 40 minutes. Note that if using an air-fryer reduce the temperature and check after each 20 minutes.

Book Review

From the Lenham Library


his is one of those books I wanted to race through because the plot is so gripping and yet wanted to slow down and read passages twice because they are so beautifully descriptive.

The tension is almost unbearable in parts. There is also humour. Who knew that bored hidden servicemen had to be reprimanded for throwing balls from house to house and giving away their locations!

The book is based on the true story of the fragile safety that the Vatican City provided for those resisting the Nazis in occupied Rome in 1943.

In reality the network of Hugh O'Flaherty, the priest at the heart of the book, was responsible for saving nearly 7,000 lives. In a desperate bid to break the network and assert control, Berlin sends a new Gestapo Head, Paul Hauptmann, to terrify the city into obedience. The two men are set up as rivals.

The plot builds towards the "Rendimento", which is the movement of a large number of hidden refugees and resistance fighters



out of Nazi-held Rome. On Christmas Eve O'Flaherty has to distribute large sums of money to people in hiding and organise their escape from the city. The plan relies on knowledge of secret passages, backstreets and tunnels and the competence and integrity of the agents working across Rome.

The mission is chaotic and confusing. It draws you in because of the danger that could lie round the next

corner. The sense of peril is immense. I was almost holding my breath at certain points. One of the best books I have read in ages. I cannot recommend this book highly enough.

Normally I review a book that is in stock at Lenham Library, but you will have to request this one. I have no hesitation in saying it is well worth the £1 fee.

Or you could get it for free on the excellent Libby App as either an eBook or an eAudiobook. (If you haven't looked at Libby yet then you are missing out. You can also read newspapers and magazines on the free apps with your library membership.)



ducation is the closest thing we have to a silver bullet. It might be a cliché in politics, but it's one which still holds true. Investing in people is the single best thing we can do to improve the world around us. It spawns the doctors, engineers, and business people of tomorrow. It lights a spark in people who go on to change our lives for the better. And it gives people lots of the tools they need to navigate life.

That's why of all the things we've achieved in government since I became an MP, our record on education is the thing I'm most proud of. At the last Budget school spending increased to its highest real terms ever – across both primary and secondary education. This is great news for schools and pupils, but it's only half of the equation. What matters most isn't what you're putting in; it's what you're getting out.

The fairest way to measure this is generally through international comparison. Grade inflation makes it tricky to compare UK figures year-on-year, but how we match up globally can't be fudged. Since 2010 England has flown up every international league table – for science, for maths, for reading. Children in England are now the most literate in Europe, and the fourth most literate in the world. That hasn't happened by accident. It's thanks to a huge programme of reform – giving schools greater freedom but also holding them more accountable for their actions. And the numbers speak for themselves.

The proportion of children in good or outstanding schools has risen from 66%

in 2010, to nearly 90% today. Only 58% of six-year-olds were able to read words fluently in 2012. By 2019, the figure had risen to 82%.

I've made it one of my five priorities to help students get the most from their education locally. Whether that's helping our local schools win investment - like The Lenham School to get more classroom space through the School Rebuilding Programme, or Queen Elizabeth Grammar, Sheldwich and Graveney Primaries to get improvements through the Condition Improvement Fund, Whether that's supporting better standards locally - like the brilliant Snowfields Academy in Bearsted which caters for students on the autistic spectrum and was recently rated Outstanding by Ofsted. Or whether it's bringing opportunities to students thinking about the next step - like my Maidstone Apprenticeship Fair.

As a government we're working hard to put technical and vocational education on an equal footing with traditional academic routes. While university can be a good option it's far from the only one, and apprenticeships are a fast-track to develop skills while working and earning.

The Fair is taking place this year on Friday 8th March at Maidstone Leisure Centre, and we've got over 1,600 students coming to meet companies from Amazon to Shepherd Neame.

Please do mention it to anyone you think might be interested. There's information about all of this on my website, and please do get in touch with me if I can do anything to support local students and schools.'

Nature Watch

SPRING IS SPRINGING!

t's that time of year when spring is in the air and nature bursts forth in an amazing display of colour and life. When you are out and about you might be lucky enough to see some of the younger generation of the local wildlife out and about too.

Foxes are one of the more common bigger mammals we will see in the British countryside. They live in burrows called "earths" and have scent glands on their feet to help them find their way at night. Normally foxes will have 4 to 5 young and you may be lucky enough to see fox cubs when you are walking through the fields around Lenham.

If you are lucky enough to see fox cubs, you could see them frolicking in play and wrestling with each other in the sun near some shelter or a safe area. Learning important skills that will help them when they are adults.

Foxes not only live in the fields and forests but are becoming increasingly urbanised and live in our villages, towns and cities. You may hear them from time to time; the male has a bark while the female makes a more chilling scream sound.

One of the more common sights you might see when out walking in the countryside is rabbits. In spring it will seem like they will be breeding like, well, rabbits and you may see many young ones around the fields nibbling on the grass, but the truth is they can and do breed any time during the year.

Baby rabbits are born with no fur and cannot see and the mother rabbits don't really take that much care of their babies. In fact rabbit milk has developed to be very nutritious because of this. However after only three weeks they can look after themselves.

Of course you will also see many species of baby bird around Lenham and the surrounding fields and woods. In the ponds you might see some ducklings or if very lucky baby swans or cygnets. The parents will be extremely busy at this time gathering food for their young.

One of the things you might notice particularly with birds is that the young



often do not look like the parents. The baby robin you see pictured here is a great example of that. Often they appear different as a form of camouflage so that they are not seen very easily and escape the notice of a predator.

However there are some young birds that look nearly the same as their parents and here is one example, the young greater spotted woodpecker. The young woodpecker has a big red patch on its head and as it matures the red patch will either disappear on the female or 'move' to the back of its head/neck if it's male.





Parish Council news

Parish Council news from Cllr. John Britt

You will see regular updates on all the parish council's activities in the *Focus*, our website and social media.

VOLUNTEERING AND LENHAM PARISH COUNCIL

ike all parish councillors, the 11 of us who currently make up Lenham Parish Council are volunteers. There should be 13 councillors, so we are currently two people short.

Lenham has been lucky over the years. Historically, enough people have come forward to engage with the work to allow us to continue to deliver services for the whole parish. But we cannot assume this will continue, especially in times when people are, rightly, looking to their own needs. Anyway, exactly what does being a parish councillor mean?

According to the 2021 census, Lenham is a large and diverse parish, with a population of around 4,700. Inevitably because nothing ever stands still (much as we would like it to) this number is growing, and, as it does, so the amount of activity the parish council needs to do increases.

The parish council has two main work streams: planning and everything else not related to planning.

In terms of planning, there is the Lenham Neighbourhood Plan (LNP) to deliver. The LNP sets out how 1000 new homes will be delivered up to 2031. It describes where the new homes will be, what infrastructure will be needed and how it will be delivered. The plan also includes policies to protect the countryside from additional unwanted and/ or unsustainable development.

This is important because the Neighbourhood Plan has been used successfully to protect

the countryside and deal with several opportunistic developments which have come forward in the last 18 months or so. The plan sets out the agreed "development footprint" and, so far, we have successfully managed to defend this

The parish also has a responsibility as a statutory consultee on planning applications. This takes up a significant amount of time as some of these are quite detailed and a response is often needed at short notice. There is also a "Highways Improvement Plan" which is discussed and agreed with KCC, in its role as the Highways Authority.

The "Everything else" tag includes:
Maintaining green spaces (like the picnic site at Rayners Hill and William Pitt Field); making sure the three play/recreation areas are safe to use; ensuring the Lenham Cemetery is suitably maintained; looking after the trees that the parish "owns"; responding to national and local occasions - in 2022 we dealt with the Platinum Anniversary of the late Queen then worked with others to mark both her passing and the accession of King Charles in 2023.

All these things must be paid for, so the parish council sets a parish precept to cover the (ever increasing) cost of the services people expect. Whilst our precept seems relatively large, the parish sits in the middle of Kent parishes in that respect. To ensure both the money and the things it pays for are kept in order Lenham employs two staff; a Parish Clerk and a Responsible Financial

Officer. This may need to be revisited in the future as the workload grows.

This May the parish council is up for election and we would really welcome some new people to come forward to get stuck into parish affairs. When I joined (back in 2018) a friend of mine had visions of the parish council meetings along the lines of those portrayed in the Vicar of Dibley (No, no, no... yes!). She couldn't have been more wrong!

Lenham, like all the parish councils I have come across over the last few years, is an extremely efficient and professional group which has the best intentions of the parishioners we serve. Everything is done in





But sometimes a simple acknowledgement of the presence of good in a person can help that person to step above their negativity and to begin nurturing their positive traits.

4. Make it a habit. We have no idea what impact we may have on the lives of other people. Every time we meet someone, we influence them in some way. Why not make it a positive one? And here is another quote:

arch is the month in nature of renewed hope as spring really takes shape before our eyes.

The weather affects the new growth and, if adverse, sometimes spoiling the first show of daffodils or blossom, but in general the warmth filtering through and increased light makes us all feel good.

This year with Easter so early (Sunday 31st March) we are already well into Lent having begun that back on February 14th – bit tricky – chocs and romance versus giving up chocolate for Lent??!

The year often seems to fly past. There are occasions when many of us are glad that it has gone quickly, especially if it's been a hard year for some personal reason. An update on our work & dates for 2024



The Friends of St Mary's Church, Lenham

he Friends of St Mary's team have had a busy start to the year. In January, we completed some minor repairs to the lighting in the church porch and arranged for a new exterior porch light to be fitted, with the intention of improving visibility at the entrance to the church.

The planned repairs to the damaged parquet flooring have also been carried out. The flooring experts who carried out the work advised us that the parquet was originally laid in the late 17th/early 18th century, which is significantly earlier than originally thought. The blocks are 4 cm thick, and nowadays 2cm are the thickest you can get. The blocks were all carefully taken up, repaired where necessary then re-laid, sanded and varnished. The floor looks beautiful once more and will hopefully continue to do so for a very long time.

We hope it won't be too long before work begins on the replacement of the stonework around the West Door. The necessary permissions for the work have been obtained, the stonemason has received the stone and has begun to work on it in his studio; we just need some kinder weather in order for work to begin.

We've also been busy planning events for 2024. We'll be holding a Safari Lunch on Sunday 2nd June and The Annual Village Barn Dance on Saturday 21st September.

You may remember our last Safari Lunch in 2018, which was great fun and we're looking forward to holding this event once again this year. Ten local hosts will each welcome four guests for a starter course and four different guests for a main course, with the guests moving to a new location for their second course; we'll then all meet up in The Tithe Barn for a fabulous dessert buffet! Tickets will be limited and information about sales will be available in due course. All proceeds from the Safari Lunch will go towards our work to preserve Lenham's listed church building.


Lenham Community Centre's 20th Anniversary Celebration - 20th April 2024
